DESCRIPTION OF THE REQUISITE AND ELECTIVE COURSES OF MASTER DEGREE PROGRAMS

A. REQUISITE COURSES OF MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM

1.
SIP
81011 - Political Thoughts

This subject discusses prominent ideologies that are developed in the West (Liberalism, Communism and Fascism). Those ideologies are generated from political thoughts of a number of great philosophers such as Locke, Rousseau, Montesquieu and Marx. Therefore, this subject studies a number of philosophers that contribute to and play a big role in developing such ideologies.

2.
SIP
81012 - Political Theories

This subject provides explanation and understanding about key concepts and theories in Political Science. The discussions of those political concepts and theories comprises concepts such as individualism, collectivism, state, power, authority and legitimacy, rights, obligations and citizenship, equality, justice and welfare, democracy, reform and revolution. Hence, theories being studied are developed from these concepts. Theories that are introduced to the students in this subject utilize the contribution of Hannah Arendt's thought that perceives political problem as an active participation of the public life. Furthermore, in building her theory, Arendt sees that social problems would become political problems, which is in Arendt's terminology, the politisation of the social. Therefore, in developing topics or subjects from political theories, the discussion would focus on the issues of social justice, theories of democracy; feminism political theories, post modernism and new social movement as well as debates between libertarianism and communitarianism. Besides, there will be a discussion on theories of power and the state.

3.

81013 - Comparative Politics

This subject discusses theories in Comparative Politics. Theories that are discussed range from theories in the structural-functional approach, institutional approach, Marxist to political development. Besides discussing those theories, this subject also provides insights on contemporary theories in Comparative Politics, such as theories of legitimacy, political violence and transition to democracy as well as redefinition of Political Science and gender approach. In this subject, the students are required to understand at least two countries as a case study to analyze comparative politics and in order to implement theories and approaches that have been studied.

4.
SIP
83012 - Indonesian Politics

This subject consists of 3 (three)

core discussions, namely the core issues in political history (historiography of Indonesian politics); the development of political institutions and three political thoughts of Indonesian political figures. In discussing the political history, it will elaborate key trends and indicators of each historical period, which include the end of the Dutch colonial era; the Japanese Occupation era; the era of revolution for independence; the Parliamentary Democracy in the 1950s; the Guided Democracy era; the New Order era and the Reform era. The aspect of political institution development, particularly discusses the development of executive body; legislative body and judicative body; the development of military-police (TNI-POLRI) and the development of political parties. The third part discusses the political thoughts of national figures such as Sukarno, Hatta, Natsir, Tan Malaka and Sjahrir.

5.

82011 - Political Development

This subject provides advanced knowledge on concepts, theories and analysis related to political development to create democratic political system. Additionally, there are also concepts and theories related to contemporary political phenomena such as: national integration, multiculturalism, identity politics, radicalism & revolution, and gender that is related to human rights in terms of democratic state, and military issue.

6.
SIP - Research
Methods in Political Science

This subject discusses five topics: (1) Research paradigm and theory in political science; (2) Survey method in political science; (3) Social statistics and Statistical Packages for Social Sciences; (4) Application of paradigm, theories, survey method and statistics in a quantitative research design; (5) Application of quantitative research in the society. Additionally, this subject also discusses four issues: (1) Research paradigm and theories in Political Science; (2) Method and strategy of qualitative research in Political Science such as basic interpretive qualitative study, grounded theory, case study, narrative analysis and critical analysis; (3) Application of paradigm, theory, method and strategy in a qualitative research design; (4) Application of qualitative research in the society.

7.

83011 - The Practice of Political
Research

This subject provides a practice for the students to use research design as a real life research practice. Each student is required to propose a research design to be used before a research is conducted. The student must report the research practice and also write a report on the research result as a final paper for this subject.

82012 - Reading Course/ Literature Review

This is a preparatory stage for a thesis writing that contains research problem and theoretical framework chosen by a student under the supervision of a supervisor. With this subject, it is expected that the students can improve their understanding on the issues and theories that are relevant for thesis topics chosen by them.

B. REQUISITE COURSES FOR POLITICAL PARTY, ELECTION, AND PARLIAMENT CONCENTRATION

1.
SIP
83035 - Political Party and Representation System

This subject is a combination between theories and approaches that are used in the study of political parties and representation system with existing political practices. Besides, it also studies electoral system and the process of election. This study studies about the party system, cleavage and party system, the electoral party system, internal party politics and ideology, policy and their practices and change and reform within political parties and election.

Furthermore, this study looks at electoral system and the delivery of election, in particular observing the organizer of election (The Electoral Commission - KPU) and the electoral process. Additionally, this subject particularly studies about contemporary issues on the organization of political parties, nomination of legislative candidacy, campaign finance, electoral system, competition of political parties and representation. This subject use comparative approach in several countries.

2.
SIP
82034 - Democracy and Democratization

This subject is designed to provide clearer and comprehensive understanding and explanation about democracy. The discussion starts with understanding democracy, which discusses what democracy is and what is not. It also discusses the philosophical foundation of democracy and theories of democracy from: Arend Lijphart, Schumpeter, Dahl, and Habermas. In order to understand democracy comprehensively, it also discusses transition to democracy, transition from authoritarian to democracy and the third wave of democracy. Besides, democratization in Indonesia will also be discussed.

3.
SIP
83034 - Internship in the Parliament
and Political Parties

This subject is part of the activities of Real-Life Intern and Learning (KKN) program that combines learning activities and working or "internship" with members of parliament (DPR-RI) and political parties for a certain period of time. This activity requires students to reflect their knowledge (read: theories, concepts, approaches, methodology) that is obtained in the classroom, participate directly in the political decision making process, to be close to the center of political power so that they are engaged with the dynamic of real politics from "within", and provide opportunity for them to have such careers in political field as politicians, bureaucrats, activists, analysts, journalists, researchers, observers, lecturers or political lobbyists.

In this subject's activities, the students will become fellows for members of parliament who are sitting in the Commission, Agency or Faction within the Parliament so that they can gain comprehensive experience.

4.
SIP
83023 - Local Politics

This subject starts with the discussion on theories and approaches of local politics. Then, next discussions will be on the dynamics of local politics, where relationship between center-region (structure and institution), regional financial autonomy, the leadership of native people, multiculturalism and integration as well as regional security and defense will be discussed.

C.

COURSES FOR WOMEN AND POLITICS CONCENTRATION

1.
Perspective
of Gender Theory in Politics

This subject studies about various issues related to women, feminism and politics. In the field of politics and political science, female citizens are not regarded as politically relevant in the political analysis. Women in many countries are socially and politically marginalized in the decision-making process. This subject will find out answer of the question why this study becomes important in Political Science. In this subject, the concept of gender in the political theories that comprise public and private, feminist theory about social contract (the sexual contract according to Pateman), state and power, about equality, justice, citizenship, democracy, representation and affirmative action through quota system, are learned.

2.
Women
and Development

This subject discusses correlation between issues related to women and gender with their role in development and democracy, especially in the countries undergoing transition to democracy. This comparative politics approach becomes the main framework in looking at and discussing such focus thematically so that students will be able to reflect the

situation and political role of women in the development and democracy processes.

3.
Women
and Politics in Indonesia

This subject will discuss how the position of women practically in the dynamics of politics in Indonesia is related to the perspective of political science that is developed in the subject of Perspective of Gender Theory in Politics. The issue of political participation and representation (parties, parliament, the structure of national government, the structure of local government) become the main topics and also other various issues such as electoral system, party system, affirmative action (quota), and various obstacles of women in politics.

4.

83046 - The Politics of Public Policy

This subject comprises of 3 (three) major topics: (1) Theory and Approaches of Public Policy, (2) Politics and Process of Public Policy, which discusses the rule of the game, the system and procedures, bureaucracy, as well as the unity of the state and provinces, (3) Steps in Public Policy. Actual case studies are discussed in each semester.

D.

1.

82058 Perspective of the Theory of
Economy in Politics

This subject discusses approaches in economy politics such as: (1) Liberal approach in economy politics: foundations

of liberalism, contemporary liberalism & economy politics, (2) State approach: foundations of neorealism, understanding theory of stability of hegemony, cooperation without hegemony and several debates about the states, private and competition sector, (3) Marxism approach: historical structure of inequality and transformation problem, imperialism & capitalism, as well as Neo-Gramscianism, (4) Postmodernism: the power of development theory, the application of development theory.

2.

82056 State and Civil Society

This subject discusses various concepts and theories about civil society and the state and the concepts on how civil society influences the state's political decision. The discussion of the subject cover theories and concepts of civil society from many perspectives of political thoughts, the social and political power that influences the emergence of civil society, civil society and democracy, the movement of civil society in Indonesia and many countries in various issues such as Human Rights, Peace, Gender, and Security Reform.

3.
SIP
82023 Nationalism and Citizenship

This subject discusses two main topics, namely nationalism and citizenship. In discussing about nationalism, many theories about nationalism will be discussed, starting from Renan to Gellner; challenges that are faced by nationalism such as globalization and primordialism; institutions that unite and disperse nationalism such as military and civil bureaucracy; political party; educational institution; communication tool and transportation; cultural assimilation and marriage; and economic development. In discussing about citizenship, theory of citizenship; citizenship and nation; relationship between state and citizens as well as ideas on global citizens will be discussed.

4.

83057 Islamic Political Thoughts

This subject discusses Islamic

thoughts regarding society, state and power and schools of political thoughts that have been developed since the era of Prophet, Caliphate, Middle Age and up to present. The thoughts of prominent figures are discussed in this subject, which include the thoughts of Al Mawardi, Ibnu Chaldun, Ibnu Taimiyah, Jamaludin Al Afghani, Ali Abddurrazik and Abul A’la Maududi. By comprehending the figures’ thoughts, the students are expected to have foundation in understanding and analyzing the phenomena of contemporary political Islam in many perspectives such as Liberal, Fundamentalist, Modernist, and Puritan perspectives, which are developed nationally or internationally.

5.

83059 Capitalism and Globalization

This subject will firstly discuss theories and methodological framework as well as debates on capitalism and globalization, including about the development of capitalism, democracy & capitalism, as well as liberalization & democratization: cases of NICs. In addition, it also discusses international economy politics & crisis of liberalism and open society and its opponent.
